Dr Mayet is the Deputy Director of the National Institute for Communicable Diseases and is the immediate past chairperson of the International Association of National Public Health Institutes (IANPHI) for Africa. She serves on the Africa CDC and Prevention Expert Task Force for Workforce Development and Public Health Institute Development.

Dr Mayet is an occupational health physician and alumni of the Institute of Functional Medicine with qualifications in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene, Public Health, Health Services Management, Occupational Health and an MPhil (Strategy) from the Gordon Institute of Business Science. Currently she serves as a member of the Strategic Leadership Group of the Training Program in and Public Health Intervention Network (TEPHINET).

She has worked in international health in a private sector multinational and is currently a Board Member of the Child Health and Mortality Prevention Surveillance (CHAMPS); the Institute for Social and Health Sciences; Surveillance Outbreak Response Management & Analysis System (SORMAS) and the Southern African Centre for Infectious Disease Surveillance (SACIDS).

She is responsible international relations, surveillance, building field epidemiology capacity, biosafety and biosecurity, and is supporting the establishment of the National Public Health Institute for South Africa (NAPHISA). Her portfolio includes the transversal services of Information Technology, Communications and Occupational Health.
